



LADDER SAFETY USING A STEPLADDER SAFELY

Stepladders are commonly used in the construction industry, but they require careful use. They are not designed for any degree of side loading and are **more** susceptible to be overturned.

Avoid over-reaching. People have been killed getting down from workplaces (such as loft spaces) when they have stepped onto the top step of a stepladder which then overturned.



- Ensure stepladders are positioned on level ground and used in accordance with the manufacturer's instruction.
- Do not use makeshift or homemade ladders or self-perform repairs to damaged ladder.
- Make sure all four feet of the ladder are on a firm, dry, and level surface
- Be sure to clear the ground area around the ladder before climbing
- Only use stepladders in a fully open position. Lock the side braces and cross braces before climbing.
- Do no use a stepladder as a straight ladder in a folded and leaning position.
- Always wear proper footwear with good tread when climbing.
- Do no stand on the top two steps of the ladder unless they are designed for standing.
- Watch for people working under or around the ladder.

- Keep your body centered on the middle of the ladder.
- Avoid lifting or carrying any heavy items while climbing up or down the ladder.
- Use a ladder made out of non-conductive materials for electrical work.
- Do not use stepladders to support work platforms.
